New York

Sailing in or out of New York Harbor is an unforgettable experience -- the ship glides past the familiar skyline and, of course, the Statue of Liberty. New York offers an endless array of things to do: Visit fabulous museums, window-shop along Fifth Avenue, stroll Central Park, ride to the 86th-floor observatory of the Empire State Building or catch a Broadway show. Or, soak up the sights and sounds of one of its neighborhoods, whether it's avant-garde Greenwich Village, stylish SoHo, bustling Chinatown or the fashionable Upper West Side and, of course, Times Square.



Halifax, Nova Scotia

This city's seafaring roots run deep. Displays at the Maritime Museum include models of vessels and a Titanic exhibit. Highlights include the Citadel National Historic Park, the Nova Scotia Museum, St. Paul's Anglican Church and the Historic Properties. You can also make the short trip to the Bay of Fundy or Peggy's Cove.



Sydney, Nova Scotia

Nova Scotia means New Scotland, and the sound of bagpipes is not uncommon here. Early Scottish settlers felt the land resembled home. Take a trip to the Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Park, an amazing re-creation of a 1744 French fortress. Venture out to Bird Islands to spot the Atlantic puffin and bald eagle. The sinuous Cabot Trail along the coast offers one of the most dramatic drives in North America.



Akureyri, Iceland

With a stunning natural harbor in the Eyja fjords, Akureyri is just 30 mins from the spectacular Godafoss Waterfalls. Popular tour options include whale watching, hiking and a visit to the beautiful and serene Lake Myvatn area.



Isafjordur, Iceland

Isafjordur boasts a spectacular, unspoiled landscape. The town, located on the Westfjords peninsula in northwest Iceland, features charming shops and a maritime museum, and also is a jumping off point for excursions throughout the region. Paddle past snowdraped mountains on a kayaking adventure, take photos in front of the cascades of Dynjandi waterfall, sample traditional Viking beer and bread in Thingeyri and listen to tales of local life while enjoying fresh seafood in the village of Sudureyri. Daily cruises to Vigur island offer sightings of eiders, puffins, arctic terns, guillemoths and other birds, while a visit to the Arctic Fox Center allows you to learn about and observe the country's only native terrestrial mammal. Whale-watching safaris are also available.



Reykjavik, Iceland

Reykjavik is the capital of this jagged land of fire and ice. With its widespread lava fields, massive glaciers, deep fjords, lush lowlands and high plains, Iceland is a haven for geology and nature lovers. The city is the region's cultural and financial centre. The most popular tours visit the Golden Waterfall, the Strokkur Geyser, Thingvellir National Park, the Blue Lagoon and The Pearl, a domed building offering exceptional views of the city.
